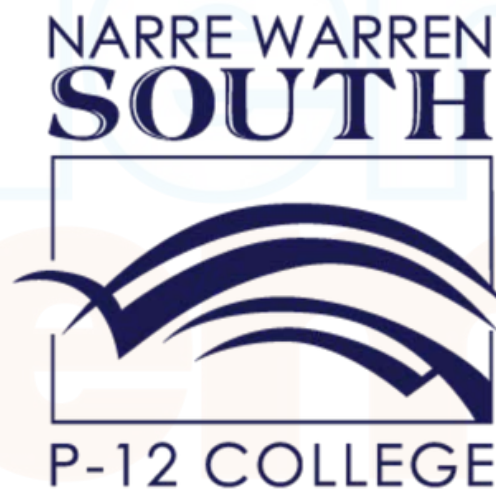

Cricket Academy at Year 9 (2027)

The Year 9 Cricket Academy classes will run for the full year (Semester 1 and Semester 2) in place of one elective subjects in each semester.

- High level cricket training sessions facilitated by our Cricket teaching staff
- Theory classroom lessons with accelerated Sports Science, Fitness Industry and careers in sport content under a cricket context.
- Four periods per week with two practical sessions and two theory sessions
- Fundamental cricket skills development and conditioning training
- Certifications:
 - Community Officiating Course (Level 1 Umpiring)
 - Community Cricket Coaching (Level 1 Coaching)

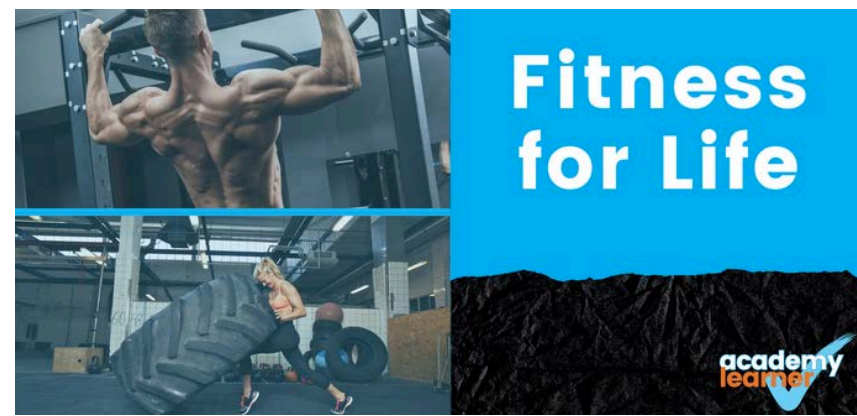
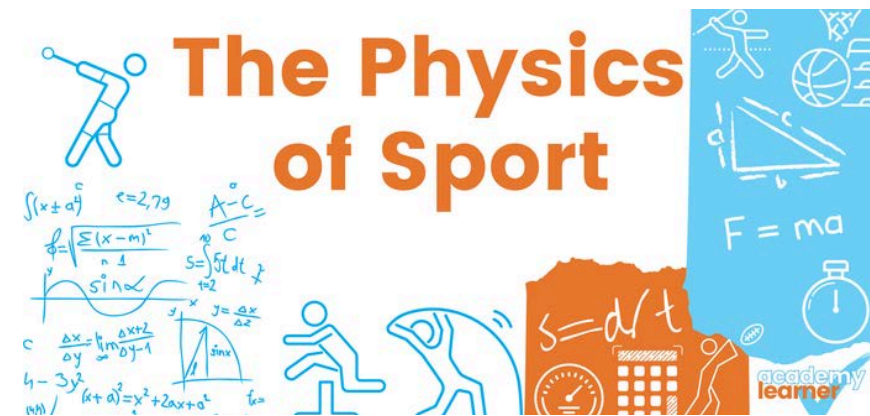
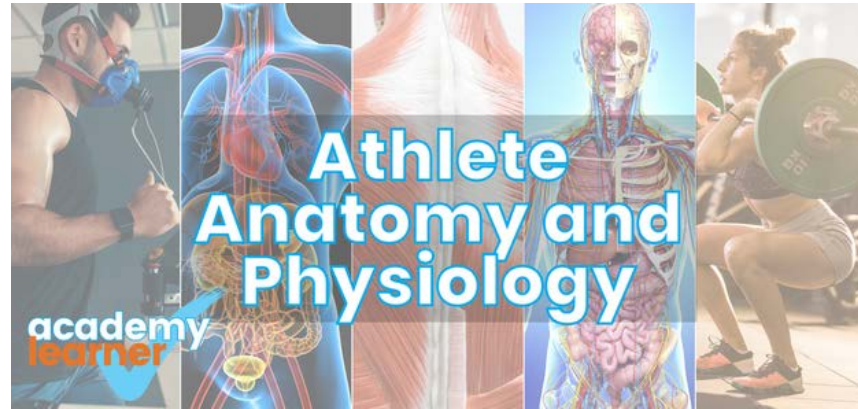

Cricket Academy at Year 10 (2027)

The Year 10 Cricket Academy class will run for the full year in place of one of the elective subjects in each semester.

- High level Cricket training sessions facilitated by our Cricket staff
- Theory classroom lessons with accelerated Sports Science content under a cricket context.
- Certifications:
 - Community Officiating Course (Level 1 Umpiring)
 - Community Cricket Coaching (Level 1 Coaching)
- Four periods per week; two practical training sessions and two theory session*

Teacher Notes: The strapper and patient should be classmates who feel comfortable working with each other strapping and being strapped. Take the time to brief the students on appropriate questions to ask when relating to touching and talking through their process and appropriate and professional behaviours.

The patient should be briefed on their injury and describe it to the student just as they would in a real-life scenario. The patient may have special requirements which should be disclosed to them prior to the assessment.

You may allow a student multiple attempts to re-sit the assessment, however, it is suggested to assess them on a body part they have not already been assessed on to ascertain whether they can be judged competent on their strapping and taping skills.

Year 10

Strapping and Taping Physical Assessment

Theory Classes

Students will complete one to two theory sessions in class per week

You will be assessed on your strapping and taping skills by strapping a specified body part. You will be required to ask the patient questions about their comfort levels and speak to them as you conduct the strapping. Remember to be professional, respectful and be conscious of the patient's needs.

Body parts you may be assessed on:

Shoulder (rotator cuff)

Shoulder (whole shoulder)

Elbow

Thumb and Wrist

Hamstrings

Calf

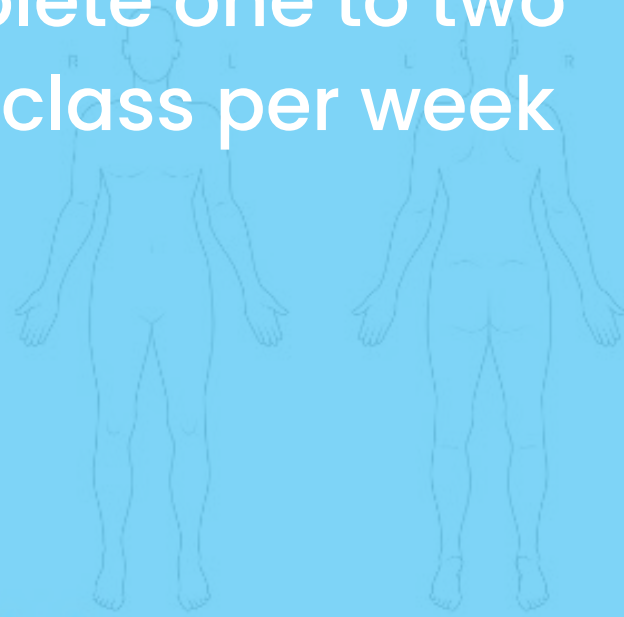
Knee (patella support)

Knee (Y-strap patella support)

Knee (rigid medial support)

Ankle (rigid for support and stabilisation)

Ankle (to stabilise, compress and reduce swelling)

Year 9 and 10 (2027)

Community Officiating Community Coaching

Cricket Australia's Community Officiating Accreditation Program replaces the old Level One Umpire Accreditation course. It is an entry level course designed for those interested in becoming cricket umpires on a regular paid basis for the first time.

The Community Cricket Coaching course is designed for people coaching players at club level, junior or senior.

Year 11 - 12

Certificate II and III in Sport, Aquatics & Recreation

Students in Year 11 and 12 classes will complete a Cert II Sport and Recreation qualification which focuses on Cricket and creates a pathway into the sports industry in the future.

Player Code of Ethics and Conduct

As a member and student athlete in the Walcom Ngarrwa Secondary College Cricket Academy, your actions reflect not only on you, but also on your teammates, your coaches, the academy, and the college. Our values and expectations for academic endeavour, teamwork, participation, behaviour, and respect are of the highest standard. At all times I will uphold the Walcom Ngarrwa Secondary College expectations of **Belonging, Curiosity and Achievement**.

Player Code of Ethics and Conduct Agreement

As a Walcom Ngarrwa Secondary College Cricket Academy member, I agree to abide by and follow the rules of the academy listed below:

- I will arrive at classes, training, games, events and/or destinations on time and be prepared. I understand that it is my responsibility to have all of my equipment needed ready for training, games and/or events, this includes uniform, drink bottle and my own playing equipment.
- I will never be violent or bully others at school, home, on the sports field or in the wider community. I am committed to stopping violence and abuse when I see it in all forms.
- I will bring a note to excuse myself from training if I have an injury, I will come prepared with other work to do during class time. If the injury persists, I will see a medical professional to determine what course of action is required to rehabilitate.
- If I am unable to make training for any reason, I will give my coaches at least 24 hours' notice with a legitimate reason.
- I will refrain from the use of drugs, alcohol, tobacco products or weapons of any kind while I am a representative of Walcom Ngarrwa Secondary College Cricket Academy.
- I understand that my behaviour reflects on my school, teammates, coaches, and Walcom Ngarrwa Secondary College Cricket Academy as a whole. I will always be on my best behaviour at training, games, in the classroom (all subjects), other team events and in the general community.

Monitoring Period

- Positions in the Cricket Academy are competitive and if a student isn't following our code of conduct or displaying "anchor" behaviours, it affects the whole academy negatively as well as them as an individual student.
- A student may be put of a performance review monitoring period at any time if they are not sticking to our high standards, to correct their behaviours, if they value their spot in the academy they will correct these behaviours, if not, their place in the academy will be given to a student who will.

Applications

Cricket Scholarship Opportunities

There may be opportunities for members of the Cricket academy that make any Victorian State Rep Cricket team for regional or national teams to apply for a school cricket scholarship.

Students must maintain a passing grade in all subjects leading into a VCE study pathway into Year 11 and 12.

Scholarship will cover Cricket Academy related costs for each year they are eligible.



Scholarship Outline

AM will provide a scholarship for the successful applicant covering the Academy fees and related costs up to the value of \$500 per school year that they are successful in obtaining the scholarship

AM will provide personalised mentoring from industry leaders and guidance towards success in the applicant's chosen career pathway



Eligibility and Expectations

The successful applicant must:
